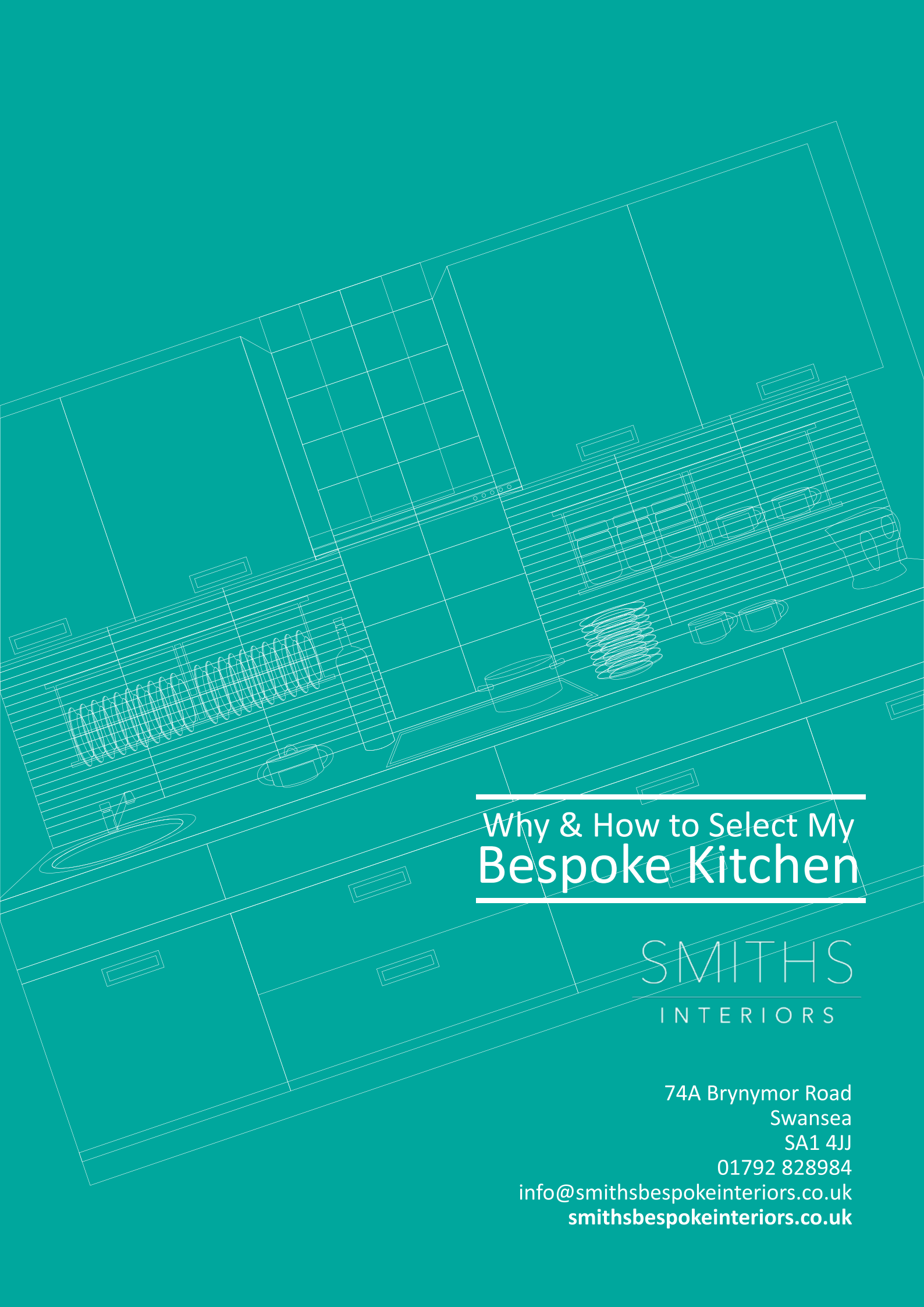




Remember it's a two way street to success
